It's times like this that make a few of us look bad in marketing. While I saw this Corn rally coming as early as last February (see my February 2006 seminars), I never dreamed it would happen this early. On the other hand, the price we receive for the rest of the crop we have will be very good.

Corn. I have figured the first objective for the Spring rally would be \$3.34 (FC/CC 334). Today we hit that at \$3.3375 on the December Futures, then backed off sharply. I never figured that the rally would start as early as it has and gone up so far in a short time. It certainly is the time to sell what you need to for your Fall needs. December 07 Corn hit \$3.43 (FC/CC 343), and then sold off sharply. Looks like a top to me. I am getting a Cash Grain Indicator sell signal on both a daily and weekly for both Current Crop and New Crop Corn. This is very powerful. Even though I am thinking that we will see higher prices for Corn in the next 18 months, you need to be 50% on this Current Crop and 10% sold on New Crop Corn.

Soybeans. Fundamentals are very bearish. With prices up where they are at this time of year, South America overnight is deciding to put in more Soybeans acres than earlier planned. This is tempering my bullish outlook for next year. November Futures went to \$6.40. The FC/CC 638 stopped the rally cold as Corn hit its magic number, also. It gave us a key reversal down today by the close. January Futures and November 07 posted contract highs before selling off. Cash Grain Indicator is giving us a sell. It's time to increase Current Crop sales to 50%. This includes a catch up sale if you are not up to current recommended sales levels. I still look for higher prices next Spring.

Wheat: Although, I don't have a sell signal, but with Corn and Beans probably at Fall highs, Wheat should pull back also. Price another 5% for New Crop, bringing you to 35% sold.

CURRENT CROP 2006 SOYBEANS: We have sold 40%. Get to 50% sold on the opening.

CURRENT CROP 2006 CORN: We have sold 50%. Catch up if necessary.

NEW CROP 2007 WHEAT: We have sold 30%. Get to 35% on the opening.

NEW CROP 2007 SOYBEANS: No additional recommendations.

NEW CROP 2007 CORN: We have sold 10%. Get to that level now. No additional recommendations.
